With a population of only 850, Greetham has an amazing facility which is the focus of many Community events. We're proud to play such a big part in our small community and will continue to try and do the very best for all of our friends and visitors. However, the Community Centre is successful because of all of you and a huge thank you as always to all our helpers, friends, volunteers, neighbours, hirers and supporters, we appreciate you!

GREETHAM PARISH COUNCIL MEETING Minutes of Meeting on 9th November 2022 @ 7pm held at the Community Centre

Finance

Approval of orders to be placed

Proposal for GPC to purchase 1 tree and pay to plant 3 in total at GCC.

Tree £115.00 plus planting £85 per tree x 3 = £370.00

Approval sought in writing for positioning of these 3 trees from Community Centre Chair. It was agreed for PH to write to CC Chair.

There was a discussion following the issues raised by the member of the public who carries out maintenance of the Burial Ground.

PH outlined the rationale for the holly bush planting and the environmental positive aspects, as oppose to the maintenance issues.

There was concern raised that although the plants are slow growing, in future years the roots will impact on the graves.

After further discussion it was agreed that the choice to remove what is already planted is not an option.

A compromise was discussed of planting the 20 proposed bushes north of where the graves are situated, so as not to impact on any graves.

It was agreed for all Councillors to meet at the Burial Ground with the member of the pubic to look at the problem raised and decide on a suitable plan and the maintenance required.

£100 donation to Citizens Advice was proposed. After further discussion it was proposed to increase the donation to £250.

Proposed by PH, seconded by KE – unanimous.

2021/0171/MAO Warehousing - Rejected

No further news at this stage regarding an appeal being submitted by the Builder.

Planning Application: 2020/0297/MIN - NW Extension to Greetham Quarry

Letter from Applicant and 2 Revised Drawings (Working Scheme G17 1 19 03 Rev E & Restoration Plan G17 1 19 04 rev D)

Revised Plans/Documents submitted – Comments to be made by 26th November.

DB reported on the revised plan submitted which has removed Phase 4 from the application. There is concern that if this application for Phase 1, 2, 3 and 5 is approved, MG may apply for Phase 4 at a later stage. MG's final intent remains very unclear.

The proposed wording with response to RCC was discussed which had been circulated to all members prior to the meeting for consideration.

Planning Application 2022/1224/CAT

Reduce 1 No. Maple Tree against the building by 1.5m. Reduce height of 1 No. Maple tree against the telephone line approximately 1m clear from the line.

Sewage Pumping Station Stretton Road Greetham Rutland

The Tree Warden has visited the site – there are no objections.

Approval to support the application.

Decision Notices

Ref: 2022/0779/FUL – Extensions including entrance porch, bay window and single storey rear extension.

Beech House, 9A Church Lane, Greetham LE15 7NF

RCC have granted planning permission.

Ref: 2022/0914/PTA – 1 No. Ash tree – Remove branches in contact with garage roof and remove dead branches within the canopy. Slightly raise the crown on the south side of the tree.

36 Main Street, Greetham LE15 7NL

RCC have granted consent subject to 3 conditions.

AGENDA ITEMS

Mobile Post Office

It was noted that Exton currently have a mobile post office up and running once per week. It was agreed that consideration of adopting this in Greetham will be discussed and considered at the next meeting in January.

Greetham Traffic Issues

A letter has been received from RCC regarding participation in the 2023 Community Scheme Speed Watch Scheme. This was considered, but not supported, as the scheme only allows this to take place in a 30mph speed limit which is very limited in Greetham Village.

Healthwatch Update

AJ reported on a positive meeting she had attended on 3rd November with lots of questions and answers. The minutes will be published shortly and will be circulated to all for information.

It was noted that anyone with general healthcare issues should contact Healthcare Direct for further information.


