

Matters arising

Pond Lane Parking Issue

GM reported that a meeting was held at Oak House on 3rd June, attended by Preston Walker, a Pond Lane resident and representative from GPC. Since the meeting Preston Walker has replaced the signage to make it clearer, and has written to all suppliers asking them to not block Pond Lane when making deliveries (preferably to park on the other side of Oak House or Main Street).

The Pond Lane resident has since reported an issue with a vehicle parking on the green at the corner of Pond Lane, causing a near collision, which has been reported to the police.

Greetham Memorial Bench

The Chair gave an update on the memorial bench which was a request from the family of the driver who died in the village. The bench is being delivered shortly and will be installed at the top end of the Wheatsheaf garden. There are no costs to GPC.

Fix my Parish

Over many months we have been working on the quarry planning applications - these are:

NW Extension

Extension to restoration

Warehouse Development

Residential Development

Bullimores Quarry Scoping Application

We have been chasing several RCC departments and officials for responses to an ever growing list of questions, sometimes these have received very slow responses or no responses at all and this has become a major frustration.

In order to attack this issue we produced a "FIX MY PARISH" spreadsheet in which we recorded all the current outstanding issues awaiting responses, with dates and names . This was distributed to a small, but elite list of members both elected and non-elected, to see if we could unblock this log jam.

It is pleasing to report that it has proved to be most effective. The list was sent at

8.05 on 7th July and by the evening we had received over 80% of the outstanding correspondence after weeks of chasing in some cases. We will continue to use this to inform GPC members.

Planning Application 2021/0170/MAO Housing & 2021/0171/MAO Warehousing

The Quarry Focus Group and SWAG are now focusing on

Biodiversity and Ecology report

We are challenging the Leicester Ecology Consultee response to the Developers Consultants Ecology report which states that the warehouse development will produce a higher biodiversity score than what is currently on the land.

This is due to the fact that, due to poor enforcement of the phased restoration, an invasive plant species (Pirri Pirri Burr) has taken hold in the quarry and has reduced the land quality to poor.

The importance of these former limestone quarries for supporting calcareous grasslands is identified within the County Biodiversity Action Plan 2016 - 2026. This is very relevant to the former Greetham Quarry, particularly as there remains legal obligations for it to be restored to a calcareous grassland. It is important to remember too that the operator has stated such works are nearly complete requiring only a further 2 months' work to finalise.

North West Quarry Extension – Planning Application 2020/0297/MIN

The decision notice on this planning application has not been issued in response to our Protocol Letter receiving attention from RCC.

We have a meeting arranged for 26th July with Roger Ranson (Head of Minerals Policy at RCC) and Mark Chant (Minerals NCC) to discuss their policy on mineral reserves, need and supply.

Planning Reference 2021/0617/SCO – Land corner of Thistleton Lane and Stretton Road.

A scoping document has been received to assess the feasibility of whether the land would be suitable to quarry. This is not an application at this stage.

A response letter was sent to RCC proposing the following items to be included within the request for information:

- 1 a detailed and thorough baseline survey and assessment for dust.
- 2 a detailed and thorough baseline survey and assessment for noise.
- 3 a detailed impact assessment of the proposal on the nearby SSSI, Merry's Meadow.

AGENDA ITEMS

Gates with speed signs

The new gates with speed signs have been observed at Stretton. The Chair suggested that it may be good to have the same in Greetham to help with speeding issues and to define the entry to the village at both ends.

All agreed they would be beneficial. It was agreed to put in a request with Robyn Green at Highways in September, after the speed watch in August.

Provision of Allotments

DB reported that a resident has offered some land in Great Lane which may be suitable for allotments. A standard fee would be charged to allotment holders and it had been suggested that GPC administer and manage this. After discussion it was pointed out that this would involve a lot of additional work for the PC, and although the PC would launch the idea and identify the rules, it did not have to be run by the PC if there was an interested volunteer in the village.

It was agreed to advertise in the Greetham Newsletter to assess if there is any demand. If anyone is interested in taking up an allotment, then a person will need to be found to manage it.

DB to put together an advert for the newsletter and facebook.

Defibrillator Update

KE gave an update on the defibrillator which had gone missing for a few days. This had been used by Air Ambulance for an accident in the village; they took it away with them and it ended up at Oakham Ambulance Centre, which is un-

manned most of the time. Fortunately, a first responder in Greetham managed to retrieve it from Oakham Ambulance Centre the following day.

Focus Groups

Fix my Street and Highways - PH, AJ, GM

To date there are 10 volunteers all offering limited time for the Community Speed Watch in August. PH is awaiting a training date from the Police. It is hoped that this can still go ahead, but the August dates are not the most convenient.

Agreed for GM to put a request out for more volunteers in the newsletter and on facebook – any new volunteers to contact PH.

Main Street has been resurfaced and the pathway along Main Street has been repaired and resurfaced for some of its distance. The nettles along the Viking Way (near the Plough) have been cleared. The signage (double bend) coming east into the village and the 20mph sign by the Wheatsheaf have been reported, as has the sign by the Old School.

Do you want a huge warehouse on your doorstep?

If not, please write to the Rutland Times regarding the Rutland Draft Local Plan.

In January 2021 Rutland County Councillors voted in favour of a Draft Local Plan which is essential to ensure that developers cannot build wherever they choose.

In April 2021, the same Councillors voted to reject a government grant of £30million for infrastructure to develop St George's Barracks which is a keystone of the Draft Local Plan.

In September 2021, the Councillors will vote again on whether or not they support the Draft Local Plan with alternative funding arrangements.

If they fail to approve the plan, then Rutland will be in the situation where it cannot demonstrate that it can meet development needs and will be in this position for **at least three years**.

The consequence of this will be that developers will have much freer rein to build anywhere they wish.

This may be critical to our campaign to prevent the warehouse development on the old quarry site.

Please write to the Rutland Times expressing your concern at this state of affairs, in the hope that Councillors will read the letter and vote to support the Draft Local Plan.
