

It was great to see nearly 50 people on Remembrance Sunday 13th November at our film show of the 'SOMME ... of Greetham' village production that we staged in the church on 1st July 2016 -100 years from the start of the battle. The show focused on four Greetham chaps who were at the battle, and was our village commemoration of them. It was an original drama and such was the enthusiasm of the cast and the technical crew that we have set up an Greetham Original Drama Fund to help us to facilitate more original drama penned, staged and acted by villagers. Many of us who were involved in the production hadn't actually seen it because we were busy doing it, so it was nice to experience to see it all for the first time. We also had a wonderful surprise at the film show. Mr Henry Bagshaw and his sister Eileen, the grandchildren of Private Henry Bagshaw, were there and we were also joined by the great niece of Bugler Walter Brown - Mrs Sharon Kirk and her husband Chris. We thought - who are these 'strangers to the village'?! They were so very well dressed!! In fact, they had heard by pure chance that something was going on, and had travelled from their home in Yorkshire to take a chance that it may relate to their ancestor. Henry and Walter were great friends, who worked with each other in the ironstone mines, and were in the Greetham Brass Band before the war. They had joined up together at Oakham's Victoria Hall into the Royal Army Medical Corps. It was so nice, and also very moving to see these ancestors of unfortunate WW1 friends who had not survived the war. These connections are still being made, and they help to bring Greetham's history to life. Over £100 was raised for the Royal British Legion Poppy Fund. *Paul Bland*

Tree Focus Group – update on planting programme in Great Lane. Walkers (the designated company to plant the trees) give a possible December planting window dependant on weather. The purchase and planting will be funded from the grant awarded by Cory. The RCC Forestry Officer has been supportive of the programme and thanks are offered. The Chair extended thanks to PH as part of the tree Focus Group in arranging this. Letters to be sent by Clerk to adjoining landowners for information. RCC to be informed of information provided by FH regarding a proposed electricity cable being placed in the verge of Great Lane.

A second issue is that the Local Plan document does not reflect the needs of the rural aspect of Rutland. Action: Planning Focus Group will meet to draw up a response to the Corporate Plan for presentation at the December meeting.

The Site Assessment Process will be involving Parish Councils in early 2017.

It's the most wonderful time of the year

Christmas time is almost upon us and we are again preparing for our Christmas productions. This is always my favourite time of the year, watching children blossom as they discover their inner actor or actress and develop their personal confidence through going on stage.

This doesn't mean other learning stops! We have been asking the children to really think about how they can improve their work this term, and not to be satisfied with 'good enough'. To this end, we watched a film called 'Austin's Butterfly' which helped the children look at how to improve their own work and raise their own expectations of their ability.

When a child tells you they don't like or are no good at something, encourage them to use the word YET.

"I don't like this yet" leaves room for change.

"I'm no good at this yet" gives space for improvement.



We are working with the children on 'the power of yet' - they are no longer allowed to say "I can't", but are being encouraged to see their learning as a journey and turn it into "I can't yet". A growth mindset can really help children improve by focusing on what they can do, and using these skills to support where they may find learning more difficult.
