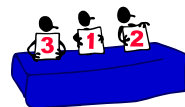

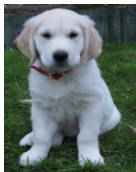

Anti-snap Locks

I have finally got round to ordering some anti-snap locks for my house, as recommended by the Neighbourhood Watch association. The locks fitted to most PVC doors can be easily defeated by burglars. Replacing the locks with a more secure type is easy - they can be removed by undoing a single screw when the door is open. However, you need to get the cor-

rect replacement. Shoe craft in Oakham can supply the locks and identify the correct type, if you take one of the old ones to them. The anti-snap locks cost about £40 each. David Hodson
