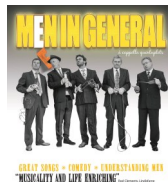

The Burial Ground tidy up has taken place. Thanks were offered to all who helped.

Photographs of pot holes have accompanied a letter to RCC Highways. A response is awaited.

A response has been sent to Cottesmore Neighbourhood Plan committee.

The trenches developing in the approach roads to Greetham have been referred to an amenities company for repair.

The RCC tree warden has responded to a request to place TPO's on trees in Great Lane.

The cherry trees in the burial ground are not in a conservation area and may be removed as they are diseased.

A discussion is planned between RCC and WP next week.

An update on Oak house – a planning application for erection of a shed has been received by RCC. The number of bins has been increased, these will be emptied regularly.

Action: RB to respond positively regarding the possible improvements to Bridleway E114.

Letter from local business – this is acknowledged. An amicable solution will be sought by negotiation.

Winter wellbeing workshop – 11/12/14.

Reports from outside bodies

A roundabout will be built at the Wood Lane junction for when the army base alternative entrance is opened in 2016.

NALC meeting attended by RW (25/11/14) raised awareness regarding the future financial responsibilities for Parish Councils.

On 29/1/15 the Neighbourhood Plan Committee have a planned meeting with local businesses. This will be followed by Website meeting which aims to collate local information for publication on the website.

LFRS – consultation meeting attended by Chair at County Hall, Glenfield. The Fire Service need to make substantial savings so propose various methods to reduce costs. These include a reduction of 12 on call posts from Oakham. Concerns expressed include the A1 accident rate and the siting of a large prison at Stocken. Consultation is required with adjoining counties (Northamptonshire and Lincolnshire). RCC are actively involved in seeking solutions.

Any other business

Christmas lunch at the Community Centre was excellent.

It has been requested that correspondence received by the PC should be made more readily available.

Oak House application for the erection of a shed – responses are required to be with the Clerk by 16/12/14

Village Notice Board – this is currently inaccessible. Minutes and agendas will be displayed in the Neighbourhood Plan window at the Village Shop.

Thanks were offered to Chair for the continued bulb planting in the village.

Comments have been received regarding the condition of the approach road to the burial ground. This is an unadopted road. For the agenda in January.

The poor condition of the footpath between Cottesmore and Greetham has been reported.

Tree planting plans are progressing.
