## **REVIEWS**

### ***The first "Greetham Gatherings" of 2015***

Unfortunately, due to a timing issue, we were unable to get the May gathering details into the June newsletter. But that doesn't mean we are not reporting upon it....

#### **May Gathering**

Well, the first of the 2015 Greetham gatherings took place on May 21<sup>st</sup>, and what a great event it turned out to be. Firstly, we were blessed yet again with the weather which was perfect for a marvellous evening. Added to that, we maintained the formula that was so successful in 2014 and changed very little. That meant a small admission fee of £1 per vehicle; fast food bar, teas coffees and cakes, and a licensed bar, were all on offer. Also a raffle took place and all profits from the event will go to the local Air Ambulance. Many thanks to Loreen Mohammed for collecting the money and to all who purchased tickets.

The event really took off at around 6:00 pm when the enthusiasts started to arrive, and we had a continuous stream from thereon until about 8:00pm. It was soon apparent that the number of vehicles – cars in particular – was going to exceed what we had witnessed at ant Gathering in the previous year. Over 70 classic cars turned out – many of which we had not seen at a Gathering before, and all generating interest from the onlookers and enthusiasts. Of particular interest this time were an Isetta bubble car, Type D Jaguar, 3 wheeler Morgans, Sprites, E-type jaguars, MGC, A unique Mercedes 1940's truck, Renault Caravelle, Lotuses, MG's, and a beautiful cream and pink VW campervan – to name just a few. We also had many other classic cars and Land Rovers, some tractors and a London Routemaster bus in attendance.

In the motorcycle park, we had BMWs, Velocettes, Suzuki 750-3, Triumph Trident, Triton, Sunbeam, BSAs, a Yamaha XS650 special, Honda CB77, Honda CB400-4, as well as about 25 more modern bikes.

The number of visitors who were not showing vehicles had also increased – to about 60. The increase in visitors meant that the parking area for classic vehicles became quite full.

### June Gathering

The weather forecast changed from a sunny day to a cloudy day, but fortunately for us again, the evening was dry if not a little on the chilly side. That did not seem to curb the enthusiasm of the attendees, as June proved to be **the byetest attended Gathering !**

The formula seems to be working as we had over 100 display cars, (and the bus!); about 80 cars in the general parking area; and about 70 bikes (30 of which were "classics"). Among the cars in attendance were Ferraris, Porsches, many Jaguars, Lotuses, MGs, Triumphs, a beautiful Scimitar, a Maserati, and too many more beautiful vehicles to list. In all, a fantastic selection spanning many motoring generations and illustrating how cars have developed from early on, through to today. Among those of note In the motorcycle park we had a somewhat rare Velocette LE (not a spectacular bike but known to the older generation as the police "Noddy Bike", a rare Weslake Mettisse, a nice AJS single, a Suzuki T500 twin, a Royal Enfield and a BSA single.

Talk among the attendees was of how much they like the event, and we are still seeing a good number of "new" attendees, along with a solid number of returnees. Again, thanks to all the helpers and supporters of this event – without you we could not be so successful. The next Gathering is on July 16<sup>th</sup> so please make a note in your diary – and bring a friend. We won't run out of beer, cakes or anything - we promise! Lastly, we'd like to set you a picture quiz challenge this month. There are 2 cars pictured from the July Gathering. One is Roly Eassons, the other isn't. Can you work out which is? ### **To approve the minutes of the meeting held on May 13th 2015**

2015/0194/ LBA: Wood burning stove installation. 31, Main Street, Greetham. Planning permission refused by RCC.



Appeals approval status of: Development of Greetham Garden Centre. Outline Planning Permission has been approved. This is a brownfield site. Representatives of the Neighbourhood Plan will approach the developers and Nick Hodgett (Planning Officer) at RCC to represent village views in the development of this site. Greetham Parish Council will continue to liaise with the planners at RCC and the developers to ensure that any financial benefit is procured to the advantage of projects within the village and that the plans are reflective of the village requirements.

Appeals approval status for development in the Northbrook Close area. The Inspector reported that it was a justified request that this was reviewed. Appeal approved. A report will be compiled for inclusion in the June Parish Newsletter. Action: RW/JD

## **A statement from the Parish Council and Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group**

You may be aware of the inspectorate decision regarding the two planning appeals for housing development on North Brook Close and the Garden Centre sites. The developers for both locations have won their appeals and building on these sites is set to go ahead.

Greetham Parish Council, Neighbourhood Plan Group and Rutland County Council (RCC) representatives are all disappointed at the appeal decision.

The Neighbourhood Plan document is in the process of being written. These planning appeals have overtaken its implementation. However, this significant document will still go ahead.

The Parish Council will continue to contact both the County Council and the developers to advance your views and influence decision making as to the type and style of houses built on the Garden Centre site. On completion of construction it is anticipated that the developers will release monies to RCC via various levies. Where appropriate the Parish Council will seek these funds to be spent on enhancements that villagers have identified.

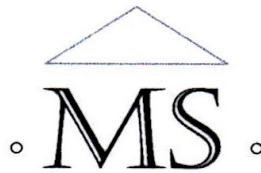
