contributed to our fund raising. It won't be long now until the first Gathering of the year, our 10<sup>th</sup> year, will be upon us and over that time we have raised and donated TWENTY TWO THOUSAND POUNDS (£22,000.00) to the Air Ambulance. Let's see how we get on this year.

## **PARISH COUNCIL**

### **NOTES - GREETHAM VILLAGE MEETING**

#### **Held on 8<sup>th</sup> February 2023 @ 6.30pm held at the Community Centre** **Parish Council Election**

It was explained that every 4 years the current parish council is disbanded and a new parish council is formed.

Anyone can apply to be a Councillor; it is open to all.

Applications can be made from 28<sup>th</sup> March and nomination forms will be available for completion.

Existing councillors who wish to stand will nominate themselves to be re-elected. If more than 8 people apply an election is held.

#### **Biodiversity Plan**

GPC have carried out a full diversity survey of Greetham village and surrounding land. We are now in phase 2 of our Biodiversity project.

The plan is to achieve the surveys recommend goals by establishing 6 project groups to manage the different habitats:

- Hedgerows and wildlife corridors

- Woodlands

- Wildflower meadows

- Individual trees

- Watercourses

- Ponds

Each group will assess the different areas and develop a long-term management plan.

There was a request for villagers to get involved, particularly the younger generation for some of these groups, with mentoring and assistance from those with knowledge and experience.

David Baker is leading the project and there will be a separate meeting for further discussion which will be advertised in the Greetham Newsletter.

#### **New Housing Plan – Old Quarry**

Outline planning permission has been granted for 30 houses in the old quarry site.

The remainder of the old quarry land has been put forward as an industrial site.

Planning permission has been refused for a warehouse.

Applicants have 6 months to appeal – until 30<sup>th</sup> March 2023.

At 30<sup>th</sup> March an enforcement order should be served to restore the old quarry.

GPC have been working with Jon Gibbison, Director of Herward Homes Greetham to influence the style of the proposed new houses. GPC have requested smaller houses and some bungalows to be included.

The Call for Sites map was viewed on the screen and discussed.



There are 4 sites, one of which is not under Greetham parish, it is opposite Begy Gardens.

A further 2 sites identified have no access from the road, site at top of Bridge Lane. The other site is behind the containers on Stretton Road.

RCC have sent GPC a response form to be completed by 10<sup>th</sup> March.

GPC Agenda item (opinions to be discussed at the PC Meeting following this meeting)

### **NW Extension to Greetham Quarry**

For the past 3 years the Parish Council together with members of the public have been actively engaged in discussions with RCC and all parties to ensure that if planning permission was granted, the conditions would be the most robust that could be applied to a quarry.

GPC have argued that Phase 4 which brings the quarry workings much closer to the Community Centre should be removed.

In December 2022, Mick George agreed that Phase 4 could be dropped from the application and on this basis the planning application was approved.

There are still ongoing discussions with RCC to negotiate that process operations should be a distance of 350 metres from the Community Centre.

The dust and noise monitoring conditions are very robust and RCC, Environmental Health, North Northamptonshire Minerals Department and the Parish Council will all have access to data.

The Parish Council Quarry Group will draft a complaints procedure and communicate this to all residents via PC Minutes, Village Newsletter and Facebook, prior to any commencement of quarry activity.

It is important that residents help GPC record accurately any issues as and when they arise.

Greetham Parish Council Quarry Focus Group have also been instrumental in setting up the Rutland Quarry Forum (RQF). This group represents other Parish Council's who are affected by quarries in their areas. The RQF together with GPC are actively engaged in providing RCC with issues and options consultation responses in respect of Minerals Policy in the new Local Plan.

GPC will continue to work closely with the Quarry Focus Group on all aspects of quarry activity and planning applications.

It was agreed for AJ to draft a suitable letter for Clerk to send on behalf of GPC. It was suggested that Anglian Water be invited to make a presentation at a future PC Meeting.

The Lord-Lieutenant of Rutland, Dr Sarah Furness completed the planting of flowering cherry trees at The Greetham Community Centre Field on February 3<sup>rd</sup>. Seven were planted last year to celebrate The Queen's Platinum Jubilee and the remaining three were planted for Her Majesty's initiative known as 'The Queen's Green Canopy'. More than 10,000 trees have been planted in Rutland recently according to Dr Furness. It is hoped that planting can continue, hopefully to celebrate the Coronation of King Charles, who has been an advocate for environmental development for many years.

## Bytham Community Shop -Approaching 3-year anniversary

It is 10 years since the closure of the last 2 shops serving the Bythams and surrounding villages, leaving a serious gap in the provision of services to those communities.

A group of determined locals began a project to fill that gap, resulting in our community opening for business in June 2020.

Notwithstanding the timing and difficulties that Covid caused, we were able to provide a vital local service during the pandemic.

The shop stocks locally sourced produce where possible and, alongside staple goods, also provides an outlet for local craft workers to sell their creations.

The cafe offers good quality coffee and tea from Fair Trade sources, as well as freshly cooked food and home-made cakes. Three years on from its opening, the shop is proving to be a huge asset; it is popular with the local community and passing trade. The shop is far more than simply a convenience store and the cafe provides an area for local groups to gather in convivial surroundings (e.g. Knit and Natter). The dry-cleaning service is well used and the carpark provides a convenient place for other services such as the Post Office van 4 times each week, the travelling fishmonger etc.



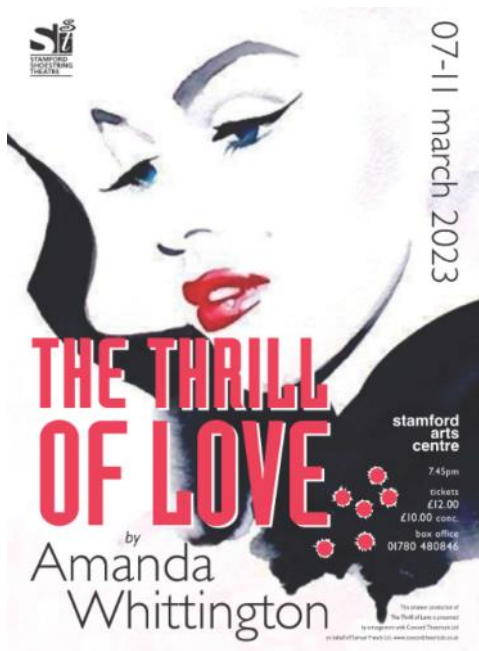

### **Visiting other countries and the past..... virtually!**

At the end of term 3 we had a fantastic Virtual Reality morning in school, where each class got the opportunity to use virtual reality to enhance their learning.

Our youngest children were able to meet different animals in different habitats, including elephants, rhinos and penguins, as well as going under water with fish.

Years 2 and 3 stepped back in time and visited London at the time of the Great Fire of London. They then stepped into modern day London and visited St Paul's Cathedral to look for evidence from the Great Fire.

Years 4, 5 and 6 visited Brazil and the rainforest – they were able to look at the different layers in the rainforest, as well as meet some orangutans.
