ADVANCE WARNING CHANGE OF DATE

We have received a notification from Highways that there will be a road closure on Main Street, Greetham for approximately 17 days to carry out work and a diversion will be in place.

The duration of the closure will now be from 16th May 2023 to 27th May 2023.

During the dates and times specified all vehicles will be prohibited from proceeding along the length of road known as Main Street from Church Lane to Little Lane to allow Rutland County Council to undertake drainage works.

GREETHAM PARISH COUNCIL MEETING Minutes of Meeting on 12th April 2023 @ 7pm held at the Community Centre

PLANNING

Planning Application: 2020/0171/MAO

Restoration of Old Quarry. The Chair reported that the end of March deadline for submission of an appeal on the warehousing had now passed. Therefore, no planning permission is now granted on the land. GPC are pushing for the land to be re-instated and restoration of the old quarry enforced.

Planning Application: 2023/0313/FUL

Proposal: Proposed vehicle access 30 Main Street, Greetham LE15 7NL After some discussion regarding the new access being close to other nearby access points and the chicane, there was unanimous agreement to respond as NEUTRAL with the following comments: 1. GPC require the Planning Officer to consult with the Conservation Officer to ensure there is

no dis amenity to the street setting. 2. GPC require the Highways Officer to look at the safety aspect.

Planning Application: 2023/0348/FUL

Variation of Condition 9 part (i) (time limit for completion of restoration) of 2016/0199/MAJ (an extension of time to enable completion of quarrying activities together with revised restoration with importation of inert materials in the southern part of Woolfox Quarry) to allow an extension of time to complete restoration operations. Woolfox Quarry, Wood Lane, Greetham LE15 7SN Following a detailed discussion, there was agreement to SUPPORT the restoration of the site, but if consented GPC would require the following conditions to be met:

- 1. Any consent of extension must be conditioned to a clearly defined timetable of actions, eg. With 3 months xxx, within 6 months YY. This would allow for enforceability of conditions. 4 2. All HGV movements to import material be barred from travelling through Greetham. If the planning authority insist approval for local imports we need to have clearly stated what is meant by local and how it is to be enforced.
- 3. Current roadways leading to are in appalling conditions. GPC require new conditions requiring the effective cleaning of road leading to the site.
- 4. If no environmental permit is required for soil import, then conditions are required to evidence of material source and quality to ensure all imports are inert.

To receive Decision Notices: Application No: 2021/0418/LBA

Existing 2 no. attached dwellings (45 & 47 Main Street) to become one dwelling including restoration and refurbishment works. Restoration and refurbishment of existing outbuilding. New dwelling proposed with new access into site proposed from Main Street. 45-47 Main Street, Greetham RCC have granted listed building consent in accordance with the application and plans submitted subject to 9 conditions.

Application No: 2022/1326/FUL

Extension to existing travelling showpersons' site, comprising of 5 no. additional yards, extension to existing yard and creation of recreation/amenity area. Five Counties Park, Greetham Inn Lane, Greetham LE15 7SB RCC have granted planning permission subject to 7 conditions.

AGENDA ITEMS

Parish Council Election

The Chair reported that only 6 current members of the parish council had been nominated, therefore no election is necessary. There are 2 vacancies for new members, recommended for co-option.

Pot Holes in Greetham

It has been noted that there are 2 large potholes in Great Lane, with many others around the village. It was suggested that the Traffic Focus Group, once membership reorganised in May, take photos around the village and send into Fix my Street.

Bulllimore's Planning Application

There has been a request on the Bullimores Planning Application for a new quarry on Thistleton Lane to include a footpath along Thistleton Lane between the Whitehouse and the main road, to facilitate safe walking by pedestrians. GPC will put in a proposal to RCC to ask Bullimores to add this in as part of their planning application.

Focus Groups

It was noted that all Focus Groups will be re-organised in May due to the new Council

Planting of bulbs in Burial Ground

There was discussion about the planting of bulbs around the new pet area. It was decided to keep the area as grass for the sprinkling of pet ashes with plaques to go on the fence surrounding the new area.

Report on Community Centre

KE gave a report on the recent success of functions at the Community Centre, such as the Murder Mystery and Comedy Evening. The Coronation weekend events were outlined which involve a kids disco on the Friday evening, followed by live screening of the Coronation on the Saturday and a Parade and Fete on the Sunday with a bring and share, Childrens' games, Tombola etc.

Voter ID

The UK Government has introduced a requirement for voters to show photo ID when voting at a polling station at some elections. This new requirement will apply for the first time in England at the local elections on Thursday 4 May 2023.

Which forms of ID can I use to vote?

You may already have a form of photo ID that is acceptable. You can use any of the following:

- Passport
- Driving licence (including provisional license)
- Blue badge
- Certain concessionary travel cards
- Identity card with PASS mark (<u>Proof of Age Standards Scheme</u>)
- Biometric Immigration document

- Defence identity card
- Certain national identity cards

For more information on which forms of photo ID will be accepted, visit <u>electoral-commission.org.uk/voterID</u> or call their helpline on 0800 328 0280.

If you don't have an accepted form photo ID

If you don't already have an accepted form of photo ID, or you're not sure whether your photo ID still looks like you, you can apply for a free voter ID document, known as a **Voter Authority Certificate**. You can apply for this at <u>voter-authority-certificate.service.gov.uk</u>.

Greetham Open Gardens 2023


