



#### WI Report April 2015

This month's meeting was held in the Community Centre on Monday April 13<sup>th</sup>. Twenty four members were present. A birthday posies was presented to Alison Brett. Tea hostesses were Alison Gossel and Pam Denning.

Our speaker was Jill Palmer, from Scalthhorpe WI. Her title was "Humorous Verse" in a very amusing presentation, Jill read a number of her poems and spoke about her approach to writing poetry. She began writing about seven years ago, and always writes about what she knows, such as housework, her children and things that annoy her. She often works backwards, writing the end of the poem first. Several poems have been inspired by her husband, including "Downhill Racer" (he is a keen cyclist) and The Widow's Lament (he is also a keen Leicester City fan). A recurring theme is road rage, particularly aimed at cyclists ("Is it me or is it them?") She also takes a perverse pleasure in unusual surnames, for example, a girl named Polly Esther who married a Mr Cotton! She recently won the Belvoir WI Group poetry competition with a poem about Bomber Command entitled "Heroes and Lovers". Two poems inspired by herself were "Creative Decorating", about the time she used creosote to decorate a staircase and "Ford Capri"—after coveting this car for a number of weeks, when she eventually plucked up the courage to ask for a test drive, she could not see over the steering wheel.

After refreshments, our President Helen McGarrigle gave a report on Whissendine Craft Fair and Langham Book Fair. Hazel Hinch spoke about the Horseshoe Group Spring Meeting, where the speaker was an astronomer from Leicester University. The Autumn Group Meeting will be held at Cottesmore. The permissions granted by RCC for the erection of a home on the Travellers Site have been adhered to.

Burial ground, the donated tree offered will be purchased and planted.

GPC delegated power to grant permission to open Great Lane gates to Clerk. This will be included in the AGM.

Wood Lane. Issues regarding mud and dust have been addressed by RCC.

NALC and LRALC membership - £218.03. Deferred till June.

Amendment of Bank Terms and Conditions. The signatories have provided the details required. In future yearly expenses will be approved for Electricity, Water, and RCC etc. and these bills will be paid by Standing Order.

**Planning:** 2015/0194/LBA – Wood burning stove installation: 31, Main Street, Greetham. Comment to be placed on RCC Planning page: Greetham Parish Council requires detailed plans in order for a response to be given.

2014/1004/MAJ: Solar photovoltaics with associated infrastructure at Woolfox depot, Woolfox Lodge Road, Empingham.

Comments to be placed on RCC planning page: GPC would prefer the location to stay as farming land. As long as the location is screened and does not have a visual impact there is no further objection. GPC requires that at the end of the life of the solar farm the land must be returned to agricultural use. The planning application does not finalise the route of the proposed electricity grid connection. If approved, Greetham Parish Council support Route A (i.e. burying the cables long the A1)

#### **Neighbourhood Plan Update**

Quotations are being sought for site allocation and the process of applying for a grant is underway.

A Workshop for young families and older people is planned on 20/4/15 5.00 at 6.30 (Community Centre)

#### Western Power Update

Communication from WP states that work should recommence in mid- April and that WP have applied for traffic lights to complete this work. GPC would like formal, written confirmation of this. Action: PH

#### **Highways Update**

Following a meeting between DH, Chair and Neil Tomlinson (RCC Highways) the following information has been shared:

- In line with the RCC Highways Inspection Policy, Great Lane and Little Lane are classified as "Local access roads" and inspected at a frequency of six months. The inspector makes a subjective judgement to categorise any defects and arrange remedial action as appropriate. This would usual be a temporary repair using cold fill material with a limited life. In Great Lane and Little Lane, the main issues are the deterioration of the road surfaces where a) service trenches have been dug and sub standard repairs made and b) road edge deterioration due to lack of a kerb. Reductions in funding for repair work over recent years have had a significant impact on the road repair programme. In the next financial year RCC will review the way in which roads are maintained and it may be more cost effective to do better repairs to larger areas of the road surface rather than piecemeal temporary repairs to small areas.
- Attention was drawn to three other matters. a) deterioration on the white road markings
  on speed humps at either end of the village. There has been a fatal accident in recent times
  at one of these locations b) a "Dangerous Bend" sign which has fallen down on Thistleton
  Road and c) a broken cover on the path to Cottesmore with a deep hole thereunder.
- In connection with the 20mph speed limit in the village RCC Highways is currently awaiting information from other villages undergoing the same exercise, so that the paperwork for all the locations can be completed at the same time. You believe that subject to due process the 20mph limit will come into force in Greetham at around June/July 2015

#### **Any Other Business**

Quarry application update. JC declared an interest and left the room. RB declared a non-pecuniary interest. The restoration plan is not stated and therefore traffic volume cannot be estimated. GPC are concerned about the volume of traffic and request that figures be based on normal quarry working and not on the use of the site as a proposed waste dump. GPC will also request that traffic approach is via the A1 and nor through the village.

Parish Council Forum – report received.

A request will be made to RCC environmental officer to check the wooden buildings situated on the Viking Way in proximity to the chicken sheds. Action: Clerk


AGM – The Standing Orders will be followed to compile the Agenda.
