### Greetham Women's Institute October 2018

This month's meeting was Members' Night, when the committee organise the evening and provide refreshments. Twenty-five members and two guests were present. Birthday posies were presented to Hazel Hinch and

Pam Collin. Members were encouraged to sign up for the annual Council meeting in Leicester in March, when the speaker will be Gyles Brandreth.

Our Secretary, Gill Hodson was wearing a fetching black T shirt, with the words "It's grimm up north! (sic) All was revealed when our speaker was introduced----Gill's daughter Jane, an academic in the English Department of Sheffield University. Jane is involved in an exciting project to improve child literacy. The project is based in the South Yorkshire town of Rotherham, in a magical establishment owned by Mr Grimm. The shop opened to the public in 2016 and although largely intended for magical creatures, humans can visit. Every kind of magic artefact can be bought there, including such sunlight, vile darkness and essential bottled products such as Grandma's Scabs! School trips are very popular---the children must pass through the magic door to the writing centre, which is essentially a writers' closet with added ivy infestation. DH/PH/RCC/ Rappleys and Goodwin consultants were present. The objective was to resolve the issue of the trees. There is a formula which exists to determine the value of the trees. Rutland Tree Officer has completed the formula and arrived at the figure of £11,965.92 which includes all of the trees; those previously removed and those remaining.
