The Community Centre Constitution sub-committee (DH/KE/JC/RW) have held a meeting to devise an action plan. This includes a proposed meeting with the present and immediately previous chairs of the Community Centre. It is suggested that Jeremy Prestcott be contacted for further advice.

Neighbourhood Plan. A Councillor from Edith Weston is prepared to meet with Councillors to discuss the process required to compile the plan. A broad spread of residents from the village will be required to ensure a range of views are represented.

Planning permission, Greetham Lodge Farm. RCC planning officer has visited the

site and confirms the proposed construction is slightly smaller in size than the existing building. On these grounds Greetham Parish Council will submit no objection.

The Parish Council Insurance will cover the theft of any cash held on behalf of Greetham Parish Council on condition that the procedures outlined in Standing Orders are adhered to. The adopted phone box will also be covered by the existing insurance policy.


