

#### **REVIEWS**

#### WI report, September 2015

Twenty members attended the September meeting. Lorraine Pierce was in the chair. Birthday posies were presented to Sandy Beggy, Pam Dennis and Lorraine. Tea hostesses were Sandy Beggy and Pam Colin.

For the second month in succession, our appointed speaker was unable to attend but we were extremely fortunate to have secured the services of a distinguished stand-in, Dr Laurence Howard, Her Majesty's Lord Lieutenant for Rutland. He brought severable items of interest, namely his ceremonial sword, his letters patent and royal seal and a Union Jack car pennant (apparently for useful for securing a parking space)!

The Lord Lieutenant's Role dates from the 16<sup>th</sup> century and was created by Elizabeth 1<sup>st</sup>. Each Lord ran a private militia to help preserve the Queen's peace in turbulent times. This meant great financial responsibility but was well rewarded on terms of land and titles. Military uniform is still worn today on ceremonial occasions. (Apparently it is very tight but quite flattering)! Retirement is compulsory at the age of 75. Duties include attendance at Royal visits, military funerals and parades and presentation of medals on behalf of the Queen. He often has to make impromptu speeches. Dr. Howard was appointed in 2003 following a distinguished academic career and many years as a magistrate. He has to have Royal permission to be abroad for more than three weeks a year. When asked to attend an event, the only criterion for acceptance is "Would the Queen do it?" Following a request to take part in a rock climbing demonstration, the answer was therefore quite clear! After his talk, Dr Howard kindly took questions from members.

There followed various items of business, including details of the horseshoe Group Centenary party taking place in Cottesmore on October 26<sup>th</sup>. Our next meeting in Greetham will be on October 12<sup>th</sup>, when Dianne Hurrell will give a demonstration of Christmas Wreath making.

#### The August and September Gatherings

Unfortunately, owing to holidays and publication timings, we weren't able to get a write up of the August Gathering in the September Newsletter. We apologise for that and will put that matter to rights now.

The August Gathering was yet again another good weather event and it attracted good numbers of vehicles and spectators ("gatherers") alike. In fact we had as many cars through the gate as we did in July, and just a handful fewer bikes. An additional attraction in August was the "Motoring through the Ages" feature presented by David and Paul Bland. This proved to be both interesting and popular with the gatherers and we are grateful to both David and Paul for putting this on.

Among the cars on display this time were an Aston Martin V8, 2 beautiful Singers





from different times, 2 green and a blue VW Camper van, a purple Isetta bubble car, an AC, a Gilbern Invader estate, a nice Riley just to name a few. On the motorcycle front we had a BMW single cylinder, a BSA 250cc single that once lived in the village, a Spanish Montessa (don't see too many of them these days), a nice Velocette single, Norton Commando and AJS twin, as well as a brace of Harley Davidsons. We also had a Dexta tractor, our village Routemaster bus and some military vehicles to round things off

The September Gathering is the last one of the year and this is our shortest event as it starts to get dark quite early. Notwithstanding that, and the usual late arrival of most gatherers, we had a good turn out and as we expected, numbers were down. Having said that, we had some great vehicles on display, and what is very pleasing is that we still attract gatherers who have not been before, so you must be putting a good word out for us amongst your friends.

We had a nice mix of classic cars attend, some old favourites and regulars, and some we had not seen before. We were treated to, amongst others, a beautiful red soft top Mercedes, a yellow 2CV Citroen van (in great condition), a lovely Austin 10/4, convertible, Alpha Romeos, Aston Martin, several Land/Range Rovers, a smart light

blue Bentley, a Ford Zephyr, a Ferrari and many more old favourites. There were also 3 E-type Jaguars on display. We think we may have to ban these in future as they are obviously so common now their value is probably dropping as you read this article. There is also no truth in the rumour that our local garage in Cottesmore is changing to be a Jaguar agency – that's simply not true (yet!). Around 60 classic vehicles were on display.

In the motorcycle park, we had some nice machines, including a return of the Rudge 500cc Sports Special, a Honda CB500-4, 2 BSA A10 650cc twins, several BSA singles, Triumph Bonneville's, a Suzuki T500 2 stroke twin, and a couple of Harley Davidsons – to name a few. In all there were over 40 motorcycles of all ages present.

The next Gathering is on 19<sup>th</sup> May 2016 so please make a note in your diary – and bring a friend. Our success is down to the gatherers who generously attend and participate in the spirit of the event – that's you! We thank you and hope you will continue to support us. Thanks must go to those who organise the event (Gilbert, Roly, Debbie, Mike and Martin); those who help on the days (Brian K, Janet T, Sue B, Thomas, Malcolm and Bill); the raffle coordinator (Loreen); sustenance providers (Andy and his team); the cakes and drinks ladies (Carol F, Maureen H, Ros M and all who donated cakes), the bar staff, Richard Greig for cutting the grass for us, and anyone else who I may have forgotten (Sorry!) – all of whom make the event the success it is. We know that we have made a significant increase in the amount raised for the Air Ambulance, and we shall publish details of how much along with a picture of the cheque presentation once we have it all organised, in a later newsletter and on the website (www.greethamgathering.co.uk)

#### **Greetham Parish Council**

#### Response to proposed Quarry housing development

The Parish Council has set up an independent Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group to develop a Neighbourhood Plan for the Parish of Greetham. This work is in progress. It is not therefore appropriate at this time for the Parish Council to deliberate in general terms on housing policy matters. It will only comment on actual planning applications, as and when they arise.

The situation as far as the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group is as follows.

Rutland County Council Planning Department have advised that Mineral Rights Land cannot be included in a Neighbourhood Plan. Should it be included, the plan would be rejected by the inspector appointed to check the plan complies with the law.

The views of the residents of the parish (as shown by the Neighbourhood Plan Questionnaire) clearly show that the residents are in favour of a modest number of additional houses in the parish and that they should be scattered in small numbers around the village. For the above reasons, a development of the quarry will not be supported by the draft Neighbourhood Plan.

Note: Since the Neighbourhood Plan questionnaire exercise was completed, the Garden Centre housing appeal was upheld and an additional 35 houses will be built within the parish.
